Brigid Sings 2024: Project Summary

Kildare County Council Arts Service, Music Generation Kildare and Sing Ireland, with support from Creative Ireland Kildare, joined forces to develop a group singing project for primary school children and young people throughout the county to celebrate Brigid in 2024.

The project consisted of five newly commissioned songs by Kildare Singer Songwriters - Inni-K, Lea Heart, Megan O'Neill, Sal and Sive. The commissioned songs and overall musical production was overseen by David Hayes, who worked with each song writer to support their learning and development across the project, Each song was shared with all the primary schools in the county along with padlets of resources, which inlcuded games, activites, the lyrics and practice videos for the songs, along with a suite of illustrations and colouring pages to accompany each song, by Kildare illustrator, Laura Dempsey. Each set of resources also included the Irish translations of the songs. The commissioning began in December 2023 and the songs and illustrations were completed in March 2024, when they were shared with the schools through the Kildare Education Centre, Socail Media, and by email.

Throughout April and May 2024, musicians from Music Generation Kildare and Sing Ireland travelled the length and breadth of the county, working with children and young people to learn, perform, and explore Brigid's story through music. The project concluded in June 2024 with a Gala performance in St Brigid's Cathedral, in Kildare Town, with 121 young singers perfroming the songs with the songwriters for an audience of family and friends.

Project Outcomes: June 2024

- 5 commissioned songs.
- A suite of illustrations for each song.
- Six padlets of Resources.



- Engagement with the Resources by 37 schools.
- An Introductory zoom call with 868 students online from across the county, along with the singer songwriters, musical directory David Hayes and Alan, Elaine, Jenny and Dermot from the Brigid Sings partnership.
- Weekly sessions for 5 weeks in six schools by Music Generation Musicians Educators (MEs) reaching 757 children on a weekly basis.
- Workshops in 16 schools across the county with the MG Kildare MEs and Sing Ireland Facilitators reaching 2,427 children and Young people from Junior Infants to sixth class, including the SEN units in 4 schools and two schools for children with additional needs.
- A gala perfromance with 121 children and young people from around Kildare, the five singer songwirters, the musica director, 3 MG Kildare MEs and 11 singers from the Irish Youth Choirs perfroming to a packed audience of approximately 330 people in St Brigid's Cathedral, Kildare Town.

Hailing from Kildare, Lea's grandparents gifted her an old grand piano when the first lockdown commenced and it was during this time Lea honed her craft and song-writing skills. After setting herself up on socials, Lea began to share her isolation creations to an increasingly engaging audience garnering her a substantial TikTok following in a short space of time. It was on here Lea shared a snippet of her soon to be first single 'Older' to her 40,000 fans.

With her star on the rise, Lea continued to dazzle audiences with her soul-stirring performances, captivating crowds at sold-out venues and major festivals alike. From supporting renowned acts like Lewis Capaldi and Sigrid to gracing the stages of iconic venues such as the 3Arena and Malahide Castle, Lea's talent knew no bounds.

Her self-titled EP, released in 2021, further solidified her status as an emerging force in the music industry, claiming the number one spot on the iTunes chart and earning her accolades such as the IMRO award for Biggest Homegrown Single 2021 with her track "IDK Why."




